# Speed and traffic monitoring

The Speed Indicator Device (SID) was deployed in Barton Road in April-May, checking the speed of vehicles entering the village. 12,295 vehicles were monitored, an average of 394/day, with an average speed of 26.7mph and an 85<sup>th</sup> percentile speed of 36.7mph.

In June the SID was moved to the southern end of Bosworth Road, again checking the speed of vehicles entering the village. 22,850 vehicles were monitored, an average of 848/day, with an average speed of 34.7mph and an 85<sup>th</sup> percentile speed of 43.8mph. #### **Friends of St Andrews Church Carlton**

Who are we? Well, the Friends was founded in 1994, when the Quinquennial Church inspection revealed major dilapidations, and there was a risk that the Church might be declared unsafe and closed. The Parochial Church Council (PCC) and the Parish Council (PC) cooperated to appoint the first trustees and establish a 'Fabric Fund', which adopted the current name on registration with the Charity Commission in 1996 (Charity number 1056025).



The constitution of 1996 is still in force today, and states that the five trustees shall hold the trust fund and its income and apply them in 'care and maintenance of fabric of St Andrews Church Carlton.'

The founding trustees were Bill Sharp, Murray Lockwood, David Swallow, Anthony James and the late Bob Edmunds, and with the passage of time other trustees became involved - John Whitehead, Jeff Hawksworth, Geoff Stratford, Enid Morgan, Caroline Tupling, and Robin Arnold.

Over the past 29 years the Friends have raised funds with the support of the community and been able to donate sums to the PCC towards repairs to the tower, nave, chancel and vestry, windows and stonework, roof and the lightning conductor, as well as church rewiring and the automation of the clock, to a magnificent total of £93,893.

The Friends also contributed to the recent development of the St Andrews Community Hub. With the successful completion of this project, Murray, Bill and Jeff retired as trustees, and are thanked for their unstinting commitment and support to the Friends over a combined total of more than 77 years of service.

The current trustees are Irene Peat (Chair), Paul Boston (Treasurer), Geoff Stratford, Lindsay Hague-Morgan, and Richard Dolman.

In the Carlton Parish Plan of 2021, the church was important to 64% of respondents as a historic building, to 58% for the sense of community, and to 38% for social gatherings. These results are similar to those of 2001, when 70% of respondents wished to see better use made of the church building.

The trustees remain determined to assist the PCC in the effort to keep the church open for the community and fundraising will continue. Please look out for updates in Carlton News, and please contact me if you have any questions or suggestions, especially as we approach the Friends' thirtieth anniversary in 2024!

### **Climate Action Group**

Climate change is now becoming obvious and is beginning to have direct impacts on Carlton with record temperatures and more frequent violent storms. These impacts are already set to intensify because of the amount of  $CO_2$  already in the earth's atmosphere. If our production of  $CO_2$  is not reduced, life on earth will become very difficult if not impossible for our grandchildren.

A recent report estimates that the Parish of Carlton produces something between 3,100 and 4,300 tonnes of CO<sub>2</sub> each year, with each household producing an average of around 27 tonnes, against a national average of around 16 tonnes.

As a community we need to investigate practical ways of reducing our production of CO<sub>2</sub>. The *Carlton Carbon Footprint Report* was discussed at the July PC meeting: the minutes of this meeting are on the PC website. A copy of the full report can be downloaded from the Parish Council website or will be emailed to anyone interested on request.

It has been suggested that a **Carlton Climate Action Group** be formed to look at what other groups are doing, suggest practical actions, and publicise schemes suitable for our community. Please contact me if you are interested in helping to create a CCAG.

# **Coronation tree planting**

On Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> July an *Amelanchier* 'La Paloma' was planted in the churchyard by Claire Harris (nee Gannon) to mark the Coronation of His Majesty King Charles III. Claire was a member of the 1<sup>st</sup> Carlton Brownie Pack who planted trees to mark the Silver Jubilee in 1977, and it was a pleasure to welcome her back to Carlton on a special visit for this celebration.

This planting is the most recent marking of a Royal milestone. Earlier in this Coronation year two seedling sessile oaks were planted in the Diamond Jubilee Orchard and one at Harry's Grave.





The Silver Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth II in 1977 was marked by the planting of the weeping silver birch on the north side of the church and the copper beech on the south by the 1<sup>st</sup> Carlton Brownie Pack.

The Queen's Golden Jubilee in 2002 was marked by the erection of the Carlton Jubilee Post across the road from The Gate Hangs Well, followed by a party. The post was unveiled by the oldest and youngest parishioners.

The Queen's Diamond Jubilee in 2012 was marked by the creation of the Jubilee Orchard, and the planting of a sessile oak (*Quercus petraea*) at the Main St/Barton Rd junction by the youngest village resident, with some help from her mother and the PC Chairman.

More recently, the Queen's Platinum Jubilee was marked by the planting of three trees – a crab apple, Japanese rowan and Chinese hornbeam - in the churchyard behind the PC noticeboard. Two of these trees were planted by former members of the 1977 1<sup>st</sup> Carlton Brownie Pack, and the other by members of the 1<sup>st</sup> Market Bosworth Beaver group, 1<sup>st</sup> Market Bosworth Scout Group, and St Peter's Primary School.

#### **Policing Update from your Local Beat Team**

It was a great opportunity for PC Allan Charles to attend the Carlton Parish Council meeting on Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup> July 2023 alongside the chairman and councillors to discuss with attendees the rise in concerns relating to incidents of both crime and non-crime within the local area.

Anti-Social Behaviour includes incidents from threatening and harassing behaviour through to vandalism, graffiti, neighbour disruption, and drug use. Whilst the Police might not always be the primary agency best suited to assist in resolving these issues, it is essential that we are made aware when they do occur. Leicestershire Police alongside local councils and additional third-party agencies work most effectively when a collaborative approach is adopted, this meaning that through effective partnership working the very best resolution can be sought.

When incidents of Anti-social behaviour are reported to us, this enables us to formulate a comprehensive landscape view of where behaviour might be escalating or starting to worsen. When incidents are occurring and we are not made aware, this can make it extremely challenging for us to build a thorough understanding of resident's concerns. Looking specifically at our crime recording statistics for the month of June 2023, there was a total of one reported theft and one reported criminal damage during this time. There were no known reported incidents of Anti-social behaviour or additional crime aside from these.

The very best way to report non-emergency incidents is **online** at **www.leics.police.uk** where you can report incidents of crime, antisocial behaviour and more. You can also use the **101** service on the telephone, but operators are prioritised to answer emergency calls first. We understand though, that some residents may avoid reporting incidents to us for fear of further escalation and so it is important to note that crime can also anonymously be reported via Crime Stoppers on **0800555111** or by visiting **crimestoppers-uk.org.** 

In addition, we are actively seeking to encourage all residents to also join **Neighbourhood Link** (**www.neighbourhoodlink.co.uk**) this is a fantastic way for members of the community to influence the priorities that are currently being tackled within the area and provides you with a platform to have your say on how we could do that. If you are on social media platforms such as Facebook, please follows us at **Market Bosworth Police** to keep up to date with any relevant local information.

#### **Parish Council News**

- Parish Councillors we thank Simon Cooper for his contributions to the work of the Parish Council from February 2017 to May 2023. Simon decided not to stand for re-election in May, and we now welcome Robin Arnold as his replacement.
- **Waymark posts** 11 new waymark posts have kindly been provided by the County Council and are being installed by the Carlton Gardening Group.
- **QR codes** are to be installed at key points around the village and will link to the Parish Council website. The website has been updated so as to provide easy access to information about the village for the benefit of visitors.
- **Ash die-back disease** roadside ash trees in the Parish were surveyed in July. Some infected trees had recovered, and in general the disease was not progressing as fast as before—probably because the recent hot dry weather favours the trees rather than the fungus. See Report 2023-13 for the full survey.
- **Green roof** the Parish Council has granted permission for an experimental green roof to be installed on the roof of the northern bus shelter on Barton Road.

**Jubilee Orchard** – has been entered into the RHS *Its Your Neighbourhood* Scheme.

**Emergency Plan** – has been updated and adopted.

**Cemetery fees** – have been revised and implemented.

**Church gate** – a replica lamp is being made to fit in the holder above the church gate. This project is being supported by a grant from the Patston Trust.
