A garden designed to attract and support wildlife. The pots on the patio area have nectar rich flowers to feed bees and butterflies. The flower beds contain annuals and perennials and there is a wild flower area between the trees. A wildlife pond supports newts, dragonflies and other invertebrates. The garden contains 35 trees including some unusual willow and birch.

Saint Andrew's Community Hub

There is a range of trees in the churchyard, including several varieties of yew, and an extensive view from the back of the church.

A family garden with patio, small walled garden, lawns, mixed borders, fruit trees and vegetable plot. Adjoining conservation woodland planted in 2000. Guided walks of woodland at 12 noon and 3pm.

Bumble Cot

Bumble Cot is surrounded by a variety of mature shrubs and hedges, including bay, yew and copper beech. The garden is small but contains a pond, tubs, and baskets containing flowers and fruit. There is a small border with shrubs and flowers.

Drovers Barn

A relaxed and informal garden with mixed borders and a water feature supporting fish, dragonflies and the occasional grass snake (which thrive on the newts and frogs). The lower half has fruit trees, soft fruit and raised vegetable areas with views over to Barton-in-the-Beans.

Hillsdon

A beautifully proportioned family garden with interesting and varied trees, shrubs and perennials. There are a series of garden rooms with a hidden garden to explore.

Woodmill

A large plot planted in varied gardening styles including a wildflower area, mature trees, Mediterranean garden and vegetable beds. There are also borders with more formal planting, a water feature and plenty of artwork.
